ORDER OF COURT

AND NOW, this 2nd day of April, 2013, pursuant to 42 Pa. C.S.A. § 5553, any warrant issued in the 51st Judicial District pursuant to Pennsylvania Rule of Criminal Procedure 430(A), 430(B)(1)(a), or 430(B)(2) as a result of a summary traffic violation or parking ticket violation, whose date of issuance exceeds three years from the date of this Order, is hereby vacated. The Magisterial District Judge issuing such warrant shall promptly remove the warrant from MDJS, CPCMS, or any other system or list in which the warrant has been entered. Additionally, the respective citation or ticket shall be dismissed. The issuing Magisterial District Judge shall forward notice to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation that the citation has been dismissed and request withdrawal of the defendant's license suspension pursuant to Pennsylvania Rule of Criminal Procedure 470.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that on or before the 15th day of November of each year, each Magisterial District Judge within the 51st Judicial District shall vacate any arrest warrant issued pursuant to Pennsylvania Rule of Criminal Procedure 430(A), 430(B)(1)(a), or 430(B)(2) for any summary traffic offense, including parking tickets, which was issued three years prior to November 15th of each respective year. The underlying citation or ticket shall be disposed of as set forth hereinabove with appropriate notice, where applicable, to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation.
