Session #1 Monday, October 17, 2016

It PAYS to Know—Specific trends, as reported by Adams County youth on the Pennsylvania Youth Survey (PAYS) from 2007-2015. *This is a foundational presentation for the sessions to follow.

Session #2 Monday, November 21, 2016

Focusing on Special Populations—CFY members will share their priorities based on PAYS and local data. We will also examine the role of ACES and how they relate to priority areas. You will be asked to share how the youth and families that you work with are impacted in these priority areas. For example, “What does depression look like among the youth you work with – how does it manifest?” Bring your experience and expertise to the discussion to ensure that youth’s needs for prevention are identified across the continuum.

Session #3 Monday, December 5, 2016

Creating Positive Change-TOGETHER—A short overview of the role of assets or protective factors in building resiliency and addressing ACES. Sharing “what we are doing as individuals and organizations” through the prevention lens. Connecting community supports to improve outcomes for all Adams County youth.
