RE: Private Road Maintenance and Snow Removal

Typically, several times each year we are approached by township residents concerning the maintenance and snow removal of the road on which they reside.

About fifty percent (50%) of all roads in the township are considered municipal roads for which maintenance and snow removal is required. Some residents on private roads get upset when they learn this, especially when they pay thousands of dollars in taxes. While we all pay a large sum in taxes, on average, less than \$200.00 are township taxes. In addition, the State of Pennsylvania prohibits municipalities from spending taxpayer dollars on private property.

If you reside on one of the roads listed below, you will receive road maintenance and snow removal services:


