



WATER/SEWER SHUT OFF POLICY

A Water/Sewer Shut Off Ordinance, Ordinance #671, was passed by the Littlestown Borough Council on April 28, 2015.

The policy will be implemented starting with the April 2016 billing period. Bills not paid by the due date will receive a water shut off notice. Additional fees will apply to shut your service off and to restore your service.

TENANT REGISTRY

The Borough of Littlestown has an ordinance that requires owners of real estate available for rental within the Borough are required to submit a report listing the names, apartment numbers, and addresses of all persons (18 years of age or older) occupying such real estate for residential purposes; or firms, corporations, etc., occupying such real estate for residential purposes; or firms, corporations, etc., occupying such property for commercial purposes.



Any change in the occupancy of real estate rented or leased, or in the identity of the lessee from that shown on the initial report, is to be reported within ten (10) days of the change.

Any lessor failing to file a timely report, or falsifying information, is subject to a fine of up to \$300.00.

Please make sure that we have the most current information for your rental properties. The Borough will start enforcing this ordinance and fines will be issued.

Recipe **Spring Pasta Salad**

Yield: 6 to 8 servings • Level: Easy • Total Time: 35 min, Prep: 15 min, Cook: 10 min

INGREDIENTS:

Dressing:

- 1/3 cup extra-virgin olive oil
- 2 teaspoons Dijon mustard
- 1 teaspoon honey
- 1 clove garlic, grated
- 1 lemon, zested and juiced
- Salt and pepper

Pasta:

- 12 ounces cavatappi pasta, cooked to package instructions and shocked under cold water
- 4 ounces asparagus, blanched and thinly sliced on the bias
- 1 box frozen peas, defrosted
- One 12-ounce jar roasted yellow peppers, chopped or fresh peppers
- 1 pint grape tomatoes, halved
- 1 shallot or red onion minced
- 1/2 cup fresh dill, chopped
- Feta or Blue Cheese, for garnish



DIRECTIONS:

For the dressing: In a small bowl, whisk together the olive oil, Dijon mustard, honey, garlic, lemon zest and juice, and season with salt and pepper.

For the pasta: Toss the pasta with the asparagus, peas, roasted peppers, tomatoes, shallots and dill. Pour the dressing over the salad, tossing to coat.

LITTLESTOWN COMMUNITY POOL RULES

1. All persons using the pool or pool grounds do so at their own risk and are solely responsible for any accidents or injury in connection with such use.
2. The cost of property damage to the Littlestown Community Pool will be charged to the responsible party.
3. The Borough of Littlestown will not be responsible for any lost or damaged personal property.
4. All guests must present a season pass or pay the admission charge prior to entering the pool facilities. A photo ID must be presented if requested by pool personnel. Failure to do so will result in refusal of entry into the pool.
5. No alcoholic beverages, smoking, electronic cigarettes (vaping), drugs or weapons of any kind are permitted on pool grounds.
6. No profane or abusive language will be tolerated. This is a family pool.
7. No pets allowed on pool grounds.
8. All trash must be disposed of using the proper receptacles.
9. Admission can be denied to anyone with signs of illness, skin rashes or infections.
10. Appropriate swimwear is required for all swimmers. No cut-offs allowed.
11. No outside food or drink is allowed to be brought onto the pool grounds.
12. No running, horseplay or bullying. Absolutely no dunking.
13. Children ten (10) years of age and under – regardless of swimming ability – must be accompanied by an adult or a babysitter at least sixteen (16) years of age and must remain with the child the entire time they are at the pool.
14. Use of the baby pool shall be limited to children six (6) years of age and under. Each child must be supervised by an adult or responsible babysitter who is sixteen (16) years of age or older.
15. No floatation devices, inflatable items or toys will be permitted in the main pool. However, Coast Guard Approved Flotation devices permitted in the shallow area of the main pool only if the child in the water is under the supervision of a mature and responsible adult and he or she is at arm's length of that child at all times. Non Coast Guard approved water wings are not permitted. Swim goggles are permitted on slide as long as they are not made from glass.
16. Anyone unable to swim in 10' deep water cannot use the water slide except that young children with the assistance of a guardian may use the water slide during adult swims only when announced by pool personnel.
17. In the event of a storm, the pool area will be cleared for 30 minutes after the last thunder/lightning blast or sighting. The pool may be closed during the inclement weather at the pool manager's discretion (no refunds for inclement weather)
18. Pool checks will take place every hour in the main pool and at the discretion of the pool manager on duty, the baby pool, as needed.
19. Violation of pool rules may result in the suspension or withdrawal of pool privileges (memberships will not be refunded due to violation of pool rules)
20. All injuries, accidents or concerns should be reported immediately to the pool manager/lifeguard in charge.
21. Season memberships and daily admission fees are non-refundable.
22. Pool passes are non-transferable.
23. No ball playing inside the fenced in area of the pool.

Why Is Bicycle Safety So Important?

Bike riding is a lot of fun, but accidents happen. The safest way to use your bike is for transportation, not play. Every year, about 300,000 kids go to the emergency department because of bike injuries, and at least 10,000 kids have injuries that require a few days in the hospital. Some of these injuries are so serious that children die, usually from head injuries.

A head injury can mean brain injury. That's why it's so important to **wear your bike helmet**. Wearing one doesn't mean you can be reckless, but a helmet will provide some protection for your face, head, and brain in case you fall down.

A Helmet How-To

Bike helmets are so important that the U.S. government has created safety standards for them. Your helmet should have a sticker that says it meets standards set by the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC). Wear a bike helmet **EVERY TIME YOU RIDE**, even if you are going for a short ride. Your bike helmet should fit you properly. You don't want it too small or too big. Never wear a hat under your bike helmet. It should be worn level and cover your forehead. Don't tip it back so your forehead is showing. **The straps should always be fastened**. Make sure the straps are adjusted so they're snug enough that you can't pull or twist the helmet around on your head.

Take care of your bike helmet and don't throw it around. That could damage the helmet and it won't protect you as well when you really need it. If you do fall down and put your helmet to the test, be sure to get a new one. They don't work as well after a major crash.

Where to Ride

You need to check with your mom and dad about where you're allowed to ride your bike. You need to know how far



you're allowed to go and whether you should ride on the sidewalk or in the street. Kids younger than 10 years should ride on the sidewalk and avoid the street.

No matter where you ride, you need to keep an eye out for cars and trucks. Even if you're just riding on sidewalk, a car may pull out of its driveway into the path of your bike. If you're crossing a busy road, it's best to walk your bike across the street.

Road Rules

If you're allowed to ride on the street, follow these road rules:

- Always ride with your hands on the handlebars.
- Always stop and check for traffic in both directions when leaving your driveway, an alley, or a curb.
- Cross at intersections. When you pull out between parked cars, drivers can't see you coming.
- Walk your bike across busy intersections using the crosswalk and following traffic signals.
- Ride on the right-hand side of the street, so you travel in the same direction as cars do. **Never** ride against traffic.
- Use bike lanes or designated bike routes wherever you can.
- Don't ride too close to parked cars. Doors can open suddenly.
- Stop at all stop signs and obey traffic (red) lights just as cars do.
- Ride single-file on the street with friends.
- When passing other bikers or people on the street, always pass to their left side, and call out "On your left!" so they know that you are coming.

How to Prepare your Home for the Spring Season

Spring is right around the corner, and for most home owners it's an exciting time to get your home ready. In the winter time, many portions of your home are neglected or aren't used as often because of home owners staying inside their homes. From the interiors of your home to the exterior, getting your home ready for spring will ensure you'll be ready to enjoy the warmer weather once it hits. Space out your maintenance tips and by time spring is here, you will be able to enjoy the season!



- **Start on your exterior:** The outside of your home has taken more wear and tear from the harsh winter, than the interior so start here. Walk around your home and examine caulking around windows and doors, as well as open windows and doors and look at weather stripping. Replace old or cracking caulk and replace weather stripping. Inspect the roof for broken or missing shingles, or tiles, and clean out gutters and downspouts at the same time.
- **Landscaping tips:** While it may not be time for you to start planting flowers and watering your lawn, it isn't too early to ensure you will have ready your garden hoses, walkways, and adjacent areas to your landscaping. Replace cracked or old garden hoses, and rake away leaves, tree limbs and debris from sidewalks, plant beds and surrounding areas. If you no longer have snow in your area, now is a good time to start planning out your spring landscaping ideas and lawn care maintenance regimen. Pressure wash concrete and paver areas that have become dirty and power wash vinyl siding, brick walls and vertical surfaces on your home if need be.
- **Check your interior systems:** The fall and spring are the two most important times to review your home's major HVAC – heating, ventilation, air conditioning systems. Right before the harsh climatic changes are going to occur. Ensure air filters have been replaced or cleaned and stock up on new air filters if you use disposable one. Check your air conditioner before the summer to ensure it is in good working order. If you need to have a service person look at it now, it will be a lot less expensive than 3 months from now.
- **Interior spring cleaning: By now your windows** – inside and out could use a cleaning. You will be surprised how much you can see out your windows, once they are cleaned. Clean off ceiling fans, and clean out fireplaces from use over the winter. Test your emergency systems in your home: home alarm, smoke fire alarm, fire extinguisher, and carbon monoxide alarms to ensure they are working properly. Most home owners forget to test these regularly; fall and spring maintenance time is a perfect opportunity to ensure they're in good working order.

Your home goes through changes as it ages, and climatic conditions change. Spring maintenance is a good idea for everyone, and even more important if you're considering putting your home on the market soon. Home buyers want to ensure that all systems have been well attended and taken care of before buying a home. If you're concerned you will miss something, hire a professional home inspector – they will cover the entire home from top to bottom. What are you waiting for? Get started, the warm weather is on its way!

Just a couple of reminders

- **Tenant Registry:** If a property is owned within the borough limits and as the homeowner you are not living in that address and renting it out a status of occupancy form must be filled out per Chapter 39 of the Littlestown Borough Code. This form must be filled out within ten (10) days for a change in tenant.
- **TV's/Computers/Computer Components :** These items are not permitted to be picked up by your municipal waste hauler/garbage company. If you would like to dispose of these items, please contact the Adams Rescue Mission, 717-334-7502.

Littlestown Police warn of IRS scam!!!!!!

We cannot stress enough to our residents to please take caution if you receive calls from the Internal Revenue Service stating that you owe money to the IRS. This is a SCAM, a quite sophisticated Phone scam targeting taxpayers including immigrants and the elderly. Using fake names and IRS badge numbers. These con artist can sound convincing. Victims are told they owe money to the IRS and it must be paid promptly through a pre-loaded debit card or wire transfer. If the victims refuse to cooperate, they are threatened with arrest, deportation or suspension of a business or drivers license. In many cases the caller becomes very aggressive as well as hostile and insulting. Sometimes victims are told they are owed a refund in hopes of getting them to share private information. And if no one answers they will leave an urgent call back request. DO NOT call them back.



The following are guidelines to follow to avoid being victimized by IRS scams:

1. The IRS never would demand immediate payment, nor would it call about taxes owed without first having mailed a bill.
2. The IRS never would demand the payment of taxes without providing the opportunity to question or appeal the amount a person is said to owe.
3. The IRS never would require a taxpayer to use a specific payment method to pay taxes, such as a pre-paid debit card.
4. The IRS never would request credit or debit card numbers on the phone or threaten to call the local police or other law-enforcement groups to have a taxpayer arrested for non-payment.

This is just one of many scams that go on throughout the year. If at any time you receive a call like this do not provide them with anything period. They are very good at getting personal information or scamming you to send them money. Hang up the phone and call the Littlestown Police and we will discuss the incident with you. Remember the only thing that is free in this life is bad advise. If it sounds to good to be true it isn't.
