FROM THE DESK OF PUBLIC WORKS

As Spring arrives, I would like to provide information for the residents pertaining to several matters and projects.

As stated in previous town crier articles, the borough's engineering firm HRG has completed the drawings and the bid process for upgrades to the Littlestown Borough Authority Wastewater Treatment Facility BNR Upgrade Project. TAH Construction, Inc. was awarded the bid as the general contractor of the project. Swam Electric Co., Inc. was awarded the electrical contract and Davidson H.C. Co., Inc. receiving the bid for the mechanical contract. The project involves construction on the Aerobic and Anaerobic Digesters, Solid Handling Building, Electrical Building, Headwork's area, and the Plant Pumping Station. As well as Modifications to the Oxidation Ditches, Clarifiers #1 & #2, existing Control Building, Effluent Building and existing Headwork's and EQ Basin. The project is scheduled to be completed in February 2014.



Other activities, the borough will begin their Spring Street Sweeping of all hard surface streets in town starting in April. The Public Works Crew will be posting "No Parking" signs when your street is to be swept two (2) days prior to the start of the work. Please be sure to remove your parked vehicles from the street that day of sweeping, or the vehicle will be ticketed. This is also a great time to clear your sidewalks and driveways of any debris. Also the Public Works Crew will be doing pothole and alley repairs in April.

Rental property owners in Littlestown are required by Chapter 39 of the Borough Code to file a tenant occupancy form with the Borough within 30 days of acquisition of the property, or within 10 days of a change in occupancy. This helps keep tax rolls current

and to properly assess sewer and water rentals.

Your assistance with all the above is important to the success and efficiency of the Public Works Department. As always, thank you for your cooperation in these matters. If you have any questions please feel free to contact me at the Borough Office.

SPRING HAS SPRUNG!

And so has the grass and weeds. This is just a reminder that the grass and weeds on your property must be maintained to avoid receiving a violation citation. Grass and weeds are not allowed to exceed a maximum height of twelve (12) inches. Also, when cutting or trimming your grass or weeds, do not blow or deposit clippings of any kind into the roadway. If you do get some clippings in the roadway, please clean them up.

Trees and branches need to be trimmed to a minimum of seven (7) feet over any public walkway and twelve (12) feet over any public roadway or ally. If limbs or branches have fallen on your property over the winter months or you are trimming your trees, the borough has a brush pile to get rid of your brush for a fee of five (5) dollars.

Are you planning an outside building project? Whether you are building a deck, putting up a fence, or getting a shed, etc... please remember that building permits are required for any outside building project.

With the upgrade to the Waste Water Treatment Facility Borough residents can now apply for permits to have residential garbage disposals installed in their homes. Residents are required to obtain a permit from the borough and it must be installed by a qualified Licensed Plumber.

Royal Farms is well under way and should be opening this summer. This project has been a long time coming as you are well aware and the store will be a welcome addition to our community. Construction on the traffic light will begin soon which is controlled mostly by the weather conditions. Penn-Dot does not allow construction on State Highways until the temperature reaches 40 degrees consistently.

Talking to Your Children About Drugs: A Parent's Guide

On behalf of the Littlestown Police Department, I would like to present the following information on how you can help prevent drug usage by your children.

Don't put off talking to your children about alcohol and drugs. As early as fourth grade, kids worry about pressures to try drugs. School programs alone aren't enough. Parents must become involved, but most parents aren't sure how to tell their children about drugs.

Open communication is one of the most effective tools you can use in helping your child avoid drug use. Talking freely and really listening shows children that they mean a great deal to you.



WHAT DO YOU SAY?

- Tell them that you love them and you want them to be healthy and happy.
- Say you do not find alcohol and other illegal drug use acceptable. Many parents never state this simple principle.
- Explain how use hurts people. Physical harm – for example, slowed growth, impaired coordination and accidents. Emotional harm – sense of not belonging, isolation and paranoia. Educational harm – difficulties remembering and paying attention.
- Discuss the legal issues. A conviction for a drug offense can lead to time in prison or cost someone a job, drivers license, or a college loan.
- Talk about positive, drug-free alternatives, and how you can explore them together. Some ideas include sports, reading, movies, bike rides, hikes, camping, cooking, games and concerts. Involve your kids' friends.

HOW DO YOU SAY IT?

- Calmly and openly – don't exaggerate. The facts speak for themselves.
- Face to face – exchange information and try to understand each other's point of view. Be an active listener and let your child talk about fears and concerns. Don't interrupt and don't preach.
- Through "teachable moments" – in contrast to a formal lecture, use a variety of situations – television news, TV dramas, books and newspapers.
- Establish an ongoing conversation rather than giving a one-time speech.
- Remember that you set the example. Avoid contradictions

between your words and your actions. And don't use illegal drugs period.

- Be creative! You and your child might act out various situations in which one person tries to pressure another to take a drug. Figure out two or three ways to handle each situation and talk about which works best.

• Exchange ideas with other parents.



WHY DO PEOPLE USE DRUGS?

Young people say they turn to alcohol and other drugs for one or more of these reasons.

- To do what their friends are doing
- To escape pain in their lives.
- To fit in.
- Boredom.
- For fun.
- Curiosity
- To take risks.

HOW CAN I TELL IF A CHILD IS USING DRUGS?

Identifying illegal drug use may help prevent further abuse. Possible signs include:

- Change in moods – more irritable, secretive, withdrawn, overly sensitive, inappropriately angry and euphoric.
- Less responsible – late coming home, late for school or class, dishonest.
- Changing friends or changing lifestyles – new interests, unexplained cash.
- Physical deterioration – difficulty in concentration, loss of coordination, loss of weight or unhealthy appearance.
- Refuses to talk or be around family.

TAKE A STAND!

- Educate yourself about the facts surrounding alcohol and other drug use. You will lose credibility with your child if your information is not correct.
- Establish clear family rules against drug use and enforce them consistently.
- Develop your parenting skills through seminars, networking with other parents, reading, counseling and support groups.
- Work with other parents to set community standards – you don't raise a child alone.
- Volunteer at schools, youth centers, Boys & Girls Clubs, or other activities in your community.

If you are having difficulty in paying your water and sewer billing in full the Borough does offer payment arrangements or monthly payments can be made toward your account, just please note your account number with payment. Visa, MasterCard and Discover credit cards are accepted for payments either at the Borough office or online at www.littlestownboro.org. If a credit card is used for payment a minimum service fee of \$3.00 or up to a 2.45% will be charged to use a credit card.

Cyber Safety for Kids Online: A Parents' Guide

The internet has opened up a world of information for anyone with a Computer and a connection! On behalf of myself and the members of the Littlestown Police Department, I would like to offer the following tips on ensuring that your children's journey on the Internet is a safe one.

Just as you wouldn't send children near a busy road without some safety rules, you shouldn't allow them on to the information superhighway without rules of the road.

GETTING STARTED

- Explain that although a person may be alone in a room using the computer, once logged on to the Internet, he or she is no longer alone. People skilled in using the Internet can find out who you are and where you are. They can even tap into information in your computer.
- Set aside time to explore the Internet together. If you child has some computer experience, let him or her take the lead. Visit areas of the World Wide Web that have special sites for children.



CONTROLLING ACCESS

- The best tool a child has for screening material found on the Internet is his or her brain. Teach children about exploitation, pornography, hate literature, excessive violence and other issues that concern you, so they know how to respond when they see this material.
- Choose commercial online service that offers parental control features. These features can block contact that is not clearly marked as appropriate for children; chat rooms, bulletin boards, news groups, and discussion groups; or even access to the Internet.
- Purchase blocking software and design you own safety system. Different packages can block sites by name, search for unacceptable words and block access to sites containing those words, block entire categories of material, and prevent children from giving out personal information.
- Monitor your children when they're online and monitor the time they spend online. If a child becomes uneasy or defensive when you walk into the room or when you linger, this could be sign that he or she is up to something unusual or even dangerous.



TELL YOUR CHILDREN....

- To always let you know immediately if they find something scary or threatening on the Internet.
- Never give out their name, address, telephone number, passwords, school name, parent's name or any other personal information.
- Never to agree to meet face to face with someone they've met online.
- Never to respond to messages that have bad words or seems scary or weird.
- Never send a picture of themselves to anyone without your permission.
- Never to enter an area that charges for services without asking you first.

WHAT YOU CAN DO IN THE COMMUNITY

- Make sure that access to the Internet at your children's school is monitored by adults.
- Know your children's friends and their parents. If you child's friend has Internet access at home, talk to the parents about the rules they have established. Find out if the children are monitored while they are online.
- Make sure that your child's school has an Acceptable use Policy (AUP). This policy should include a list of acceptable and unacceptable activities or resources, information on "netiquette" (etiquette on the Internet), consequences for violations, and a place for you and your child to sign. Your family can design its own AUP for the home computer.
- If you child receives threatening E-Mails or pornographic material, save the offensive material and contact that user's Internet service provider and your local law enforcement agency.
- If you come across sites that are inappropriate for children when you are surfing on the Net, send the address to online services that offer parental control features or to sites advertising protection software to add to their list to be reviewed for inclusion or exclusion. Even if you don't subscribe to the service or own the protection software, you can help protect other children.


