



Garbage and Weeds

GARBAGE AND RUBBISH:

Per Chapter 382 of the Littlestown Borough Code it shall be unlawful for anybody to deposit, accumulate or to permit the accumulation of any garbage (including, but not limited to animal and vegetable waste resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking and consumption of foods) or rubbish (including, but not limited to glass, metal, paper, plant growth, wood or non-putrescible solid wastes); or to store or permit the storage of abandoned or junked motor vehicles, motor vehicle parts, furniture, furnishings or equipment on any public or private grounds within the Borough limits of the Borough of Littlestown in such a manner as to constitute a nuisance.

It shall be unlawful to store garbage or rubbish in containers other than those which shall be made of durable, watertight, rust-resistant material having a tight-fitting lid which must be kept on the container when in use. The containers must be kept clean by thorough rinsing and draining as often as necessary so as not to provide food or breeding areas for flies.

It shall be unlawful to dump, burn, bury, destroy or otherwise dispose of garbage or refuse except at an approved disposal site.

WEED NUISANCE:

No person owning or occupying any property within the Borough shall permit any grass or weeds or any vegetation whatsoever, not edible or planted for some useful or ornamental purpose, to grow or remain upon such premises so as to exceed a height of twelve (12) inches or to throw off any unpleasant or noxious odor, or to create a visual hazard at any intersection. Any grass, weeds or other vegetation growing upon any premises in the Borough in violation is hereby declared to be a nuisance and detrimental to the health, safety, cleanliness and comfort of the inhabitants of the Borough.

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. EPA/ CDC guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by Cryptosporidium and other microbial contaminants are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-246-4791)

MONITORING YOUR WATER: We routinely monitor for contaminants in your drinking water according to federal and state laws. The following tables show the results of our monitoring for the period of January 1 to December 31, 2015. The State allows us to monitor for some contaminants less than once per year because the concentrations of these contaminants do not change frequently. Some of our data is from prior years in accordance with the Safe Drinking Water Act. The date has been noted on the sampling results table.

DEFINITIONS AND ABBREVIATIONS: Action Level (AL) - The concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, trigger treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow.

Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) - The highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology.

Maximum Contaminant Level Goal (MCLG) - The level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.

Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level (MRDL) - The highest level of a disinfectant allowed in drinking water. There is convincing evidence that addition of a disinfectant is necessary for control of microbial contaminants.

Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level Goal (MRDLG) - The level of a drinking water disinfectant below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MRDLGs do not reflect the benefits of the use of disinfectants to control microbial contaminants.

Minimum Residual Disinfectant Level (MinRDL) - The minimum level of residual disinfectant required at the entry point to the distribution system.

Treatment Technique (TT) - A required process intended to reduce the level of a contaminant in drinking water.

Mrem/year = millirems per year (a measure of radiation ppm = parts per million, or milligrams per liter (mg/L) absorbed by the body

pCi/L = picocuries per liter (a measure of radioactivity) ppq = parts per quadrillion, or picograms per liter

Ppb = parts per billion, or micrograms per liter (pg/L) ppt = parts per trillion, or nanograms per liter

OTHER VIOLATIONS: We had no violations in the year 2015.

EDUCATIONAL INFORMATION: The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally-occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity. Contaminants that may be present in source water include:

Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, and wildlife. Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally-occurring or result from urban stormwater runoff, industrial or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining, or farming. Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture, urban stormwater runoff, and residential uses. Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban stormwater runoff, and septic systems. Radioactive contaminants, which can be naturally-occurring or be the result of oil and gas production and mining activities. In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA and DEP prescribes regulations which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. FDA and DEP regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water which must provide the same protection for public health.

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. More information about contaminants and potential health effects can be obtained by calling the Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

OTHER INFORMATION:

Lead: If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. Littlestown Borough is responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. Information on lead in drinking water, testing methods, and steps you can take to minimize exposure is available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline or at <http://www.epa.gov/safewater/lead>.

Nitrate educational statement: "Nitrate in drinking water at levels above 10 ppm is a health risk for infants of less than six months of age. High nitrate levels in drinking water can cause blue baby syndrome. Nitrate levels may rise quickly for short periods of time because of rainfall or agricultural activity. If you are caring for an infant, you should ask for advice from your health care provider."

Fun Facts about the Borough of Littlestown

- As originally laid out, Littlestown contained 84 lots
- The house at 316 East King Street is supposedly the oldest in town
- In 1872, the first brick school building was erected where the present Community Center stands
- The present Community Center building was built in 1901
- The Barker House, a hotel at the northwest corner of King and Queen Streets, had been built in 1848.
- The Borough of Littlestown by the Court of Adams County was incorporated on February 23, 1864.
- The first election was held in August of 1864.
The first official act of the new Council was to borrow \$2,000 "for the purpose of procuring volunteers to fill the quota of said Borough."
- Electricity went into service in 1897
- Gas was piped into the borough in 1933
The first borough water system was authorized from 1895 to 1932
- The purchase of the William V. Sneeringer property quarry in 1954 supplemented the water supply
- The sewage disposal plant was completed in 1948
- The first Post Office was established on April 1, 1795
- Rural mail service started in 1903
- The first telephone service came to Littlestown in 1892
Switchboard operator was phased out in 1961.
- St. John's Lutheran Church was established in 1763

PULLED CHICKEN SANDWICH



If you already love pulled chicken, so why not try it in a slow cooker? Savor this tender, melt-in-your-mouth chicken sandwich with ketchup-based sauce for lunch or dinner.

Ingredients

- | | |

| 3 cups thinly sliced onion | 1 tablespoon Dijon mustard |
| 1 teaspoon canola oil | 1 teaspoon onion powder |
| 1 3/4 pounds skinless, boneless chicken breast halves | 1 teaspoon ground cumin |
| 1 cup ketchup | 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder |
| 2 tablespoons cider vinegar | 1/2 teaspoon hot sauce |
| 2 tablespoons molasses | 8 (1.2-ounce) whole-wheat hamburger buns, toasted |

Preparation

1. Place onion a 4-quart oval electric slow cooker. Heat a large nonstick skillet over medium-high heat. Add oil to pan; swirl to coat. Add half of chicken, and cook 3 to 4 minutes on each side or until golden brown. Place chicken in a single layer on top of onion. Repeat procedure with remaining chicken.
2. Combine ketchup and next 7 ingredients (through hot sauce); pour over chicken. Cover and cook on LOW for 4 hours until chicken is tender and sauce is thick.
3. Remove chicken from slow cooker. Shred chicken with 2 forks, and stir into sauce. Spoon 3/4 cup chicken mixture onto bottom of each bun; cover with bun tops.

Lightning Safety

Thunder and lightning storms happen all the time. Know what to do to keep you and your family safe when storms strike!

Safety Tips

Outdoor Safety

- » **If you can hear** thunder, you are within striking distance of lightning. Look for shelter inside a home, large building, or a hard-topped vehicle right away.
- » **Do not go under** trees for shelter. There is no place outside that is safe during a thunderstorm.
- » **Wait at least 30 minutes** after hearing the last clap of thunder before leaving your shelter.
- » **Stay away** from windows and doors. Stay off porches.
- » **There is no safe place outside.** Places with only a roof on sports fields, golf courses, and picnic areas are not safe during a lightning storm. Small sheds should not be used.
- » **If a person is struck** by lightning, call **9-1-1**. Get medical help right away.

Indoor Safety

Turn off computers. Stay off corded phones, computers, and other things that put you in direct contact with electricity or plumbing. You **can use** a cell or cordless phone.

Do not wash your hands, bathe, shower, do laundry, or wash dishes.



FAST FACTS

Lightning may strike as far as **10 miles** from any rain.


